She was also one of the first dolls to be made of Dublon, which was a foam-filled type of soft vinyl. Dublon was to make her feel softer. Like a real baby.

She stands 15" and is in good shape for her age. Her head, arms, and legs are not moveable. Her facial features are painted.

Her bottle was lost along with her original outfit, but she is wearing one of her other outfits. A cute two-piece matching pajama outfit (as shown) with matching booties. She also has an additional outfit. A hot pink bath ensemble (as shown). Her pink bow is still attached and her hair looks good also.
